Hertfordshire

Hertfordshire is a county in the East of England, just north of London. It's known for its mix of charming countryside, historic towns, and excellent transport links, making it a popular spot for commuters who work in London but prefer a quieter lifestyle.

The county is filled with rolling green hills, woodlands, and picturesque villages.

Areas like the Chiltern Hills (an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty) stretch into the west of the county.

St Albans is one of the county's most historic cities, once a major Roman settlement (Verulamium). It has a stunning cathedral, a vibrant market, and significant Roman ruins.

Hertford and Ware are lovely riverside market towns with medieval charm.

There is a range of housing — from traditional cottages and period homes to modern developments. It has a reputation for being safe, clean, and relatively affluent, with good schools and a strong family-oriented vibe.

Leavesden Studios (home to the Harry Potter films) and the Warner Bros. Studio Tour is a major attraction.

The affluent communities unfortunately can hide pockets of deprivation and isolation.

In 2022 the rural population of Hertfordshire was around 128,584 (12%)

Enablers


We actively foster growth, empowerment and positive change. Creating the space for communities to do more by themselves.

- Establish funding to continue providing the people and technology needed for the programme to continue.
